ABOUT INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL MARIBOR

Leon Štukelj International School Maribor is applying for the candidacy status of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years and Middle Years Programmes in May 2023 and thus pursuing authorization as an IB World School for these two IB programmes.

PROGRAMMES IN MARIBOR

Leon Štukelj International school will apply for two International Baccalaureate programmes: the Primary Years Programme (PYP), the Middle Years Programme (MYP).

The International Kindergarten programme is also part of the PYP, and operates with established themes. One of the secondary schools in Maribor will offer the Diploma Programme DP1 and DP2.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE® (IB)

World Schools share a common philosophy, a commitment to improving the teaching and learning of a diverse and inclusive community of students by delivering challenging, high-quality programmes of international education that share a powerful vision.

“The International Baccalaureate aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

To this end, the organization works with schools, governments and international organizations to develop challenging programmes of international education and rigorous assessment.

PHILOSOPHY

“*The school will strive to offer a high-quality education that stimulates lifelong learning, develops skills and globally relevant concepts, generates good learning habits and promotes positive values.*”

It will offer a comprehensive, inquiry-based and student-centered approach to teaching and learning. It will focus on the total growth of the developing child/adolescent – intellectual, physical, emotional and social, which will be monitored and scaffolded with rigorous and holistic assessment.

Strong emphasis will be placed on the ideas of intercultural understanding and respect, responsible communication and citizenship, as well as cooperation with schools and institutions both in Slovenia and abroad.

PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAMME (PYP)

The Primary Years Programme (PYP) is for students aged 3-12, kindergarten students and students from Grades 1 to 5.

The programme focuses on the total growth of the developing child, affecting hearts as well as minds in addressing social, physical, emotional and cultural needs in addition to academic welfare.

The PYP combines the best research and practice from a range of national education systems, together with a wealth of knowledge and experience derived from international schools – resulting in a highly relevant and engaging educational programme.



PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAMME (PYP)

The Primary Years Programme offers a comprehensive, inquiry-based approach to teaching and learning. Children have to find answers to their inquiries.

The three basic questions that students have to deal with daily are:

- What do we want to learn?
- How best will we learn?
- How will we know what we have learned?

Within the framework of the PYP programme, students learn through six TRANSDISCIPLINARY THEMES per school year. These transdisciplinary units aim to weave together subject-specific knowledge with a focus on the teaching of concepts, developing greater skills, positive attitudes to learning and life, and through the development of the Learner Profile Attributes which underpin the PYP programme.

Transdisciplinarity is the key approach to binding together subject-specific knowledge in the following areas: English, Mathematics, Science & Social Studies, Foreign Languages (Slovenian, German or French), Visual Arts, Music, ICT, Physical Education, Personal & Social Development.

MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME (MYP)

The Middle Years Programme (MYP) is for students aged 11-16.

The Middle Years Programme (MYP) is a five-year programme.

It offers an educational approach that embraces, yet transcends traditional school subjects. While insisting upon a thorough study of the various disciplines, MYP accentuates the interrelatedness of them and so advances a holistic view of knowledge. Students are encouraged to develop intercultural awareness along with a genuine understanding of their own history and traditions.

The Middle Years Programme consists of eight subject groups: Language Acquisition (Slovenian and German or French); Language and Literature (English – Language of Instruction); Individuals and Societies (Geography/History) · Sciences (Biology, Chemistry, Physics); Mathematics; Arts (Visual, Musical, Performing); Physical and Health Education; · Design.

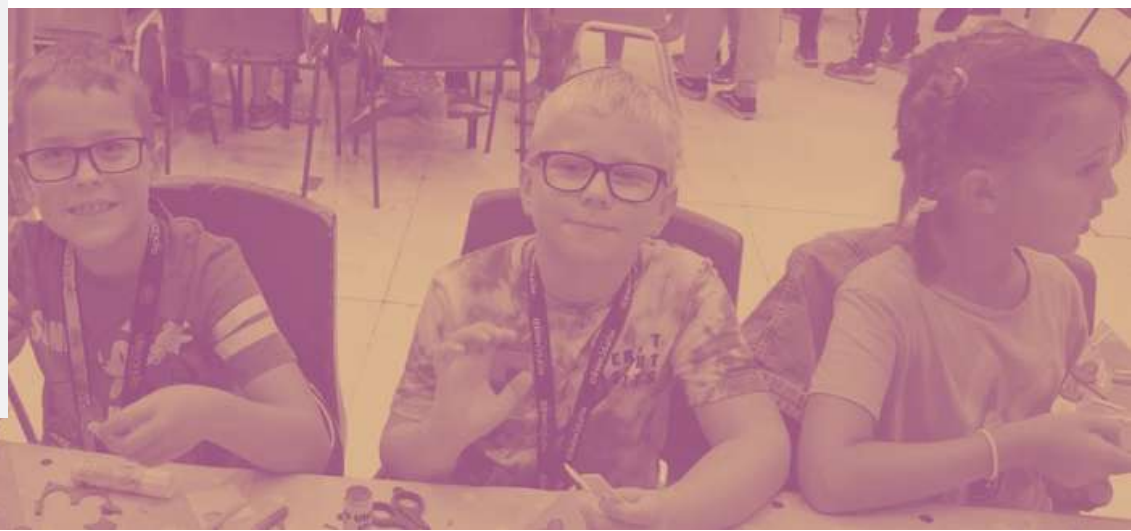
ENROLMENT FOR THE PYP AND MYP

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

The following documentation is necessary for all students applying:

- A completed application form for the International Kindergarten, Primary or Middle Years programmes.
- Academic records from the previous school year.
- A photocopy of the picture page of the student's passport or identity card.
- A recent medical health certificate.

To complete the registration, the school must receive one month's school fee which is held by the school as a deposit to cover the last month of the school year or the last month of the child's attendance fee should he/she leave during the school year.



AGE REQUIREMENTS FOR LEON ŠTUKELJ INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

The guidelines below will be strictly adhered to as a means of placing students into their appropriate grade level. The age stated refers to the age of the student before 1 September of that school year, or if a student has a report for the previously completed grade, 31 December of that school year. After a trial period of 2 weeks to 1 month, the placement can be reviewed after thorough consultation with all parties concerned.

PROJECTED SCHOOL FEES FOR 2023/2024

LEON ŠTUKELJ MARIBOR INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

The school fee covers all expenses including the use of school books, photocopies, stationery, accident insurance, and for grades 1- 10 students, also tickets for performances, excursions (transportation and entrance fees) and extracurricular activities. A discount is available if payment is made in full at the beginning of the school year. Other discounts are available, please see below.

An extra programme for grades 1 – 5 with teacher-specialists provided from the end of the normal school day until 4:10 p.m. is available for an additional fee.

Upon enrolment, a deposit corresponding to one month's school fee must be advanced as a deposit in case of lost or destroyed books, unpaid food bills or damage caused to school property, which is returned at the end of the school year, or used as the year's final monthly installment.

DISCOUNT STRUCTURE

The following discounts are available.

1. A 5 % discount is available if payment is made in full at the beginning of the school year.

2. A 10 % family discount is available for each additional child from the same family who attends our programme.

3. A 5 % discount for each additional child attending our programme, of any employee at the same firm, only in cases where the school fees are paid for by an embassy or company (and where that family has not opted for the family discount).

CATERING INFORMATION

Kindergarten Meals

Meals (breakfast, lunch, afternoon snack) are included in our school fee, as well as fruit and tea which are available throughout the day.

Meals are served in the classrooms and supervised by teachers. We encourage children to try everything that is served, but at the same time, they are allowed to make their own choices.

Meals for Grades 1 – 10 Snacks and hot lunches are available for a fee. Children who are on a special diet must bring a certificate from a Slovenian pediatrician.



THE SCHOOL AREA

The school is situated in a quiet neighbourhood of the Maribor district of Nova vas, which lies at the foot of Pohorje Hill. Different sports facilities around the school provide many opportunities for sports enthusiasts. The students can play basketball and football outside or exercise in a newly renovated gymnasium. In the immediate vicinity, there is a skate park and a large playground. The distance to the city centre is approximately 10 minutes.

THE HISTORY

Our school opened its doors on Pioneers' Day, 29 September 1983. Initially, it was a unit of the Velko Vlahović Primary School and both buildings were the most modern school buildings in the city at the time. After nine years, the units were split and became independent as Tabor I and Tabor II Primary Schools. In 1999, Tabor II Primary School decided to join the nine-year primary school programme and ploughed the way for the renewal of the school curriculum. We also started thinking about a new name for the school, as there was confusion between Tabor I and Tabor II, both locally and nationally. We've named our school after a three-time Olympian with six medals won.



WHO WE ARE

Our traditional theatre event From Stage to Stage, which transcends national boundaries, our membership of the International UNESCO Association of Schools, our Cultural School, Symbiosis School, Healthy School titles and many projects all speak to the richness of the themes and values we live by. The oldest pupils support the youngest, who have barely crossed the school threshold. With the persistent guidance of the teachers, pupils are successful in various competitions in knowledge, sport, and research.

SCHOOL MEALS

The pupils have the option of breakfast, snack, lunch and afternoon snack. As part of the ECO SCHOOL, HEALTHY SCHOOL project, the school provides healthy, varied, balanced, safe, secure and tasty food. The Slovenian Healthy Schools Network responds to child and adolescent health issues and implements proven health promotion programmes in physical, mental, social and environmental health for students, teachers and parents.
